FISH WASTE UTILISATION

In continuation with the Swachh Pakhwada activities initiated on 16th May, 2017 at ICAR-CIFT, Cochin, a demonstration on fish waste utilization was organized at Thoppampady fish market. A demonstration on preparation of silage from fish waste was conducted in the market premises to around twenty participants. The participants were retail fish vendors at Thoppampady fish market. Around 15 to 20 kg of fish waste gets generated daily in the fish market and disposal of this waste poses a problem to the vendors.
